

How can I make WiFi passwords per-user rather than per-system?

By default, newly-created wireless networking profiles are made visible to all users. I'm guessing that the idea is that if you connect to a Wi-Fi network, you are setting it up for the entire machine. That way, other users on the same computer can use the same wireless network.

If you don't like this, you can change the `allowEveryoneToCreateAllUserProfiles` group policy setting to `false`. When set to `false`, only users with `wlan_secure_add_user_all_user_profiles` permission can create system-wide profiles. That permission is granted by default to Administrators, but you can customize that by calling `WlanSetSecuritySettings` with your custom access list.

Bonus chatter: Note that being in the all users profile means that anyone can see the password. My guess is that this is the main reason for setting `allowEveryoneToCreateAll-UserProfiles` to `false`.
